The Trinity River Yacht Club #10 (TRYC) hosted the 2020 DF95 NCR RC regatta

With 51 skippers, the NCR was arranged around three fleets running HMS. The weather was arranged by Loki – the Trickster! Every day of the regatta showcased different weather and different winds. Thursday practice was Sunny and 84 with a southerly breeze at 8-15 mph, Friday morning a front blew through and we raced in cloudy conditions, temps in the mid-50s and wind from the north at 15-20 with gust up to 25mph. Saturday was cloudy to partly cloudy, temps in the mid-50s and wind dropping all from 6 to 0 mph with racing halted as it dropped off and shifted from the north to east. Sunday brought the skippers cloudy to foggy skies with temps climbing into the low-60s and an easterly breeze ranging from 6-12mph. Skippers tested and raced a range of different sail suites throughout the regatta. The other factor on Lake Ray Hubbard is the wave action. The best description of it is probably "sailing in a washing machine" when the wind is shifting around as it did. So all in all it was a thorough test for the skippers.

The varying conditions and an incredibly tough field of top RC sailing competitors were overcome by the eventual 2020 Champion through incredibly consistent sailing. Peter Feldman, while logging only one bullet, also only discarded 20 points with his 2 throw outs, the lowest of the competitors. He was continually in the top four finishers of A fleet while handling the wind, the chop, and the very tough competition.

Additionally, the event was livestreamed with commentary. Skippers that could not attend had the opportunity to catch most of the event live with both drone and static camera perspective. One thing that became apparent to skippers as they watched the event after the fact is the massive difference in perspective from an on the dock view to the drone eye in the sky. Mark hits and boat contact that was not noticeable from the dock, 75 yards away from the action (especially given the waves) showed some egregious rules violation from the drone perspective. So, there's a good reason the rules require race observers to be working from the same vantage point of the skippers.
